Connects academic learning with real-world experiences, making learning relevant



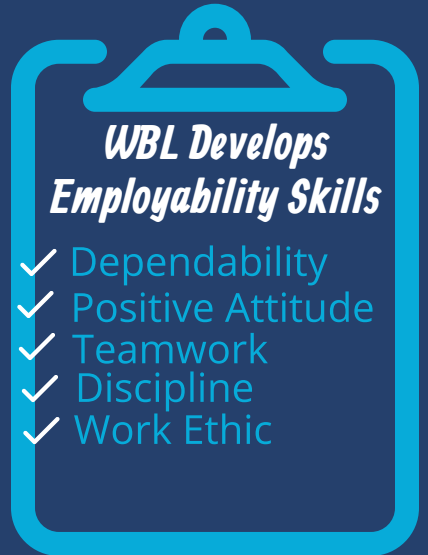
Enhances student motivation, retention, and academic success
