They tell us every cloud has a silver lining, sometimes they forget that silver tarnishes.

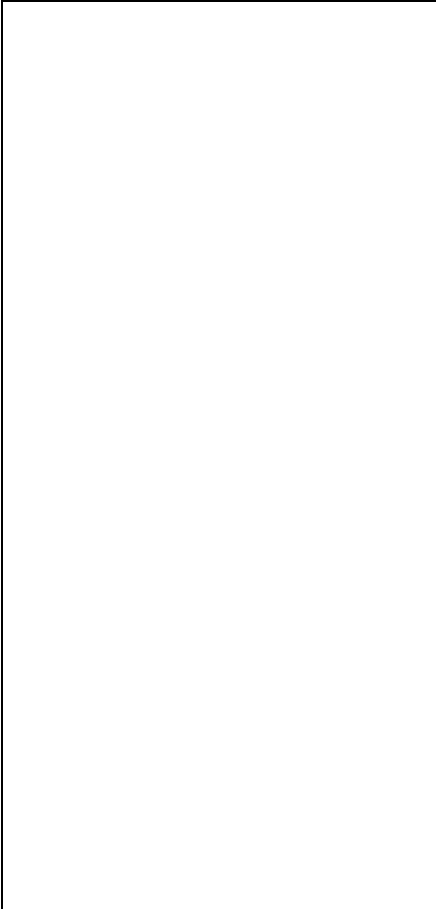
They tell us that it's only icing on the cake, Sometimes they forget that the frosting is the best part.

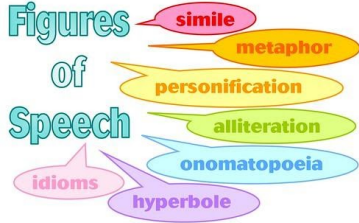
